Grant Application Review Process

- I. Make individual evaluations (read carefully and thoughtfully; take notes)
 - A. Determine if you have a conflict of interest with any of the applicants.
 - B. Eliminate those that obviously don't follow the criteria; use the RFP as a guide.
 1. Read first the grant request on the Cover Sheet
 2. Staff ensures they are qualified to apply (must have a 501(c)(3) letter or is a government agency and serves either Mobile or Baldwin counties)
 3. If unsure the request follows the criteria, read opening paragraphs of narrative. Some may be close and should be evaluated.
 - C. If the request follows the criteria well enough, read only the proposal narrative.
 - D. While reading the proposals, be objective and fair. Lay aside personal biases. Make any notes for future evaluating.
 - E. Decide which ones warrant a site visit or a call (if you have unanswered questions, want to see the facility or want to meet the staff).
 - F. Make top 3 choices.
 1. Choose those requests that are most compelling, what the donors and CFSA would most like to support (not just what you want).
 2. Rank the requests according to the program's effectiveness in meeting a community need
- II. Meet with members
 - A. Members will divide into groups. Each group will evaluate the same applicants together using a score sheet.
 - B. Each group will determine possible recipients and make recommendations to the whole board.
 - C. Board will determine top choices from all recommendations.
 - D. All groups will then evaluate the same top applicants.
 - E. Members will determine if there are unanswered questions and which applicants need site visits or calls. If needed, a site visit day will be planned to take members on a bus to agencies.
 - F. Vote on top choices and allocate money among applicants. Select agencies from different counties if possible. Consider those agencies who have never received a grant from us.
- III. Send grant recommendations to the Grant Distribution Committee and the Board of Directors for approval.
- IV. Present grant awards

Evaluating Proposals

1) What is a good proposal?

- a. Has a positive outcome – will make a difference.
- b. Targets root causes – not symptoms.
- c. Is the result of a need in the community.
- d. Targets a charitable group.
- e. Fits the criteria.
- f. Is clear and understandable, answering all questions.

2) Reviewing Grants

- a. Go through the grant and record your initial thoughts/questions – Look for the answers to the questions on the score sheet.
- b. Don't take this work lightly; this request is very important to the organization that submitted it.
- c. Be objective; it's extremely important to be fair.
- d. Pay attention to:
 - i. Benefits – will it really cause these benefits
 - ii. Who and how many the project will serve
 - iii. When the money is needed
 - iv. The appropriateness of the use of our grant
 - v. Tasks to be done to implement the project
 - vi. Appropriate, reasonable budget
 - vii. The credibility of the organization
 - viii. The feasibility of the project
 - ix. The importance of the project
